SENATOR DUTTON TO REPORT ON CURRENT LEGISLATIVE ACTIVITY THAT IMPACTS BUSINESS Summary of Legislative Session to IVBA September 28th

Senator Bob Dutton will discuss the need for the California Legislature to make private sector job creation its number one priority. California's EDD recently released figures that showed the San Bernardino-Riverside Counties Unemployment at 14.5 percent. A poll taken by the Public Policy Institute of California showed that 52 percent of Californians believe jobs should be the number one priority in this state. Senator Dutton will also discuss the debate over releasing dangerous felons onto the streets of California, his Group Home Notification Bill and other legislative hits and misses.

Senator Bob Dutton represents the southwestern portion of San Bernardino County and the area immediately around the City of Riverside. His experience as a member of the Rancho Cucamonga City Council, coupled with his experience as a business owner led to his election to California's 63rd State Assembly District in 2002. First elected to the State Senate in 2004, Senator Dutton won a second term in November 2008 when he captured nearly 60 percent of the vote. Senator Dutton serves on several Standing and Select Committees including Budget and Fiscal Review Committee (Vice Chair); Rules Committee; the Delta Conservation, Conveyance, and Governance Committee; as well as the Commission for Economic Development.
